Engineering and Surveying for Wyoming's Future

Late October found Corey Fischer and myself hunting for rams in the North Absaroka Wilderness in Wyoming. Snows earlier that month made conditions excellent. We were finding rams bedded on south-facing slopes where strong winds had cleared the snow. On one of our rides, we were glassing as many drainages as time would allow. Stopping to glass, we were able to make out the forms of three sheep grazing in a basin about two miles away. Corey thought they were worth a better look, but we needed to wait until the next day and come in from a different trail.

Next morning, we were up early and on the trail, hoping the rams had not moved overnight. What we found were two full-curl rams and a younger 3/4 curl. We tied the horses, and took everything non-essential out of our packs. It was mid-afternoon when we finally were in shooting distance. Corey thought the ram flared out was the best of the two, but it was bedded behind some dwarfed pines. We hadn't stopped to eat our lunches that day, so we ate as we waited for the rams to get up and feed. I think I was almost finished with my sandwich when Corey informed me the rams were up and feeding. My first shot was a miss, but the next two connected. I remember walking up on the ram thinking what a magnificent animal he was, admiring the wild and majestic country they inhabit.

The story would normally end here, but it doesn't. After taking pictures, we caped the ram, then boned it out. Our packs were loaded and we headed out, just as the sun was setting. After a couple of close encounters with the steep terrain and loose footing, we decided to find a place to wait out the night. We took turns feeding the fire, and each managed to get a little sleep. We were up and headed back to the horses as it got light. It took us four hours to get to the horses, and when we arrived, we were met by Mickie, Lane and John. They knew we had a sheep, but when we didn't make it back the night before, they got a little worried.

I'll remember this hunt for a long time, and the great job that Corey and the rest of the crew at Crandall Creek Outfitters did. Corey green scored the ram at 180 5/8, with 39 inches in length and 15 2/8 inch bases. What a hunt!



#### 2013 Hunt Area 3 Ram - Suzi Dunning, Encampment, WY

The rain changed from a trickle to a downpour as we approached the sheep from below. A good sight picture was a definite concern, as the timber was so thick. But, after a few of hours of waiting the rain out, and with the help of my guide Meade Dominick, his cousin Ward, and my husband Mark, I was able to get on the bighorn ram we had located the day before; I had to find a shooting lane through the timber.

The steep shot that I eventually made was difficult because of the steep uphill angle. I had learned the previous summer about distance, projection and velocity of how a bullet travels. My ram was approximately 296 yards straight uphill, and I set my rifle for 250 yards to take the shot. The rain had now stopped, and the ram had bedded down; that was good for me. As I prepared to make my shot, Mark told me to dry fire; this did the trick for me, and it helped me get my mind in the zone and forget about muscle fatigue and jitters.

I made the shot, and I heard Ward say "he's down"; immediately afterward, Meade & Mark said the same thing. It was an exhilarating experience, first to be able to draw a tag and second, to actually harvest a ram! Now the real work began to get the sheep off the mountain, and to do it quickly enough to not interrupt any grizzlies. Luckily, the wind was in our favor; we saw a huge boar grizzly that morning on the way to the sheep. Fascinating he was to look at, but not to encounter. As we were about to leave the mountain and descend down to our horses and mules, Meade buried the ram's heart, and said a prayer of thanks.



On our ride back to camp, I reflected about my preparation and excitement to get ready for a hunt like this. It all seemed very surreal now. After getting over the initial shock of drawing a tag like this, I knew I had to get serious about getting into sheep shape, so I started leaving the house before dawn every morning to hike up foothills and mountains around the ranch, and tried to make it as difficult as I could by adding squats and pushups. I also was advised on certain challenging exercise tapes. The only thing I had going for me was years of horse experience; I rode as much or even more than I normally would, and everything paid off.

The thing I worked on even more was getting my gun. With Mark being a gun enthusiast/educator, I needed to find the right rifle to fit me. It had been 15 years since I harvested a big game animal, and since then, I'd only use a shotgun for sporting clays and bird hunting. So I really had to focus on getting comfortable with just the right gun. I give a lot a credit to a friend who was an ex-Marine with sniper training. He drilled me out at our ranch's new shooting range. He worked with me on how to block out outside/inside noises, and to find a focus/calm spot. It was a great experience to have this kind of help.

I had such a great team with my guide Meade Dominick, his cousin Ward and my husband Mark. I have a lot to be thankful for, and I felt extremely blessed to have these guys with me, to make my bighorn sheep hunt so very special. I just wish I could have told my father and mother; they would have been so ecstatic! Somehow, I think they might know.....

#### A Bear Story Within a Bear Story (Kurt Eisenach, Bighorn, WY)

Spring 2013 had arrived, and with it, a new ranch to hunt. My close friend Chris manages a ranch in the Bighorn area. This year, the owner bought a neighboring property, and we had ourselves a place to bait bears. This new spot had not been bear hunted in years as far as we could tell, and hopes were high for a giant black bear. The season started off pretty well, but we were only seeing sows and cubs at the bait. Trail cameras showed lions, moose, deer, elk, and several small bears. It was a great time checking the trail cameras and hunting shed antlers, but no big bears. Somewhat frustrated with our results so far, I consulted with a friend and he assured me the wait would soon pay off; with all the sows around, a big boar will show up. Boy was he right! After several weeks of small bears, a massive black boar moved in. He was only coming in at night as you would expect, but we stayed hopeful that he would make a mistake. We finally saw him one evening coming out in a meadow about 600 yards above the bait, too far to shoot but at least he was out in the daylight. I could not hunt the next day with Chris, so he sat in the ground blind by himself. All day at work I wondered if the boar would show. It turns out he did, but Chris clipped a branch we should have trimmed and missed the giant. He was sick, and we figured the boar would not be back soon. For the next week there was no sign of him on the trail cameras, and Chris had a spring grizzly hunt to go on. However, he was very kind and agreed to let my son Kalvin hunt the bait, as he was home from college.

First night at the bait Kalvin, my other son Joseph and I squeezed into the ground blind. We were entertained by watching elk on the meadows above the bait, and a sow with her cubs. The cubs were wrestling in a big tree above the bait; it was very amusing, but still no big bears. The next night I had to work and Joe was busy, so Kalvin went by himself. After he got into the ground blind he set up the video camera, and set back to wait. I was at work but had a few free minutes so I called Kalvin on the phone. He answered, but could hardly talk. Only 10 minutes after he set up, a beautiful reddish brown boar we had not seen before came in, and just as quickly tried to leave. Kalvin had enough presence of mind to start the video camera and get on the bear for a shot. His 280 Remington with 140 grain AccuBonds dropped the boar in his tracks. He had just pulled the trigger when I called! After regaining his composure, he filled me in and then called a friend to help him get the bear out. I was sad that I could not be with him on this hunt, but the video is great and almost as good as being there. Kalvin's bear was aged at 13 years old , 6+ ft. hide,18 5/16" skull, and very fat for a spring bear. The meat was excellent and we made breakfast sausage and cube steak with most of it.

When he checked the bear in with WGFD they found a tattoo on his lip. After the Department checked the tattoo #, we were told this bear had been trapped as a 3 year old near Sundance for raiding beehives. He was transported to Cody, and released on the upper South Fork of the Shoshone River. In 9 years, this bear had traveled from above Cody, across the Bighorn Basin, over the Bighorn Mountains, and ended up near Bighorn, WY. I guess he was headed home to Sundance!

A friend who baits nearby even gave us a picture of this boar with 2 ear tags from the year before at his bait. The tags were gone, but you can tell it is the same bear. And as if that wasn't enough of a story, when we checked the trail camera, the big black boar Chris missed was at the bait with a sow 25 minutes before Kalvin got there. He is still out there, and you can be sure we are going to try for him again. All in all, we couldn't have asked for a better bear season.






